Reflections: Mission Execution

Within the Air Force inspection system, perhaps the most important major graded area rests with executing the mission. Although specific metrics do not exist to measure every Air Force or Air National Guard unit the same, commanders must use the intent outlined in Air Force Instruction 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*, to understand how to locally derive benchmarks for mission execution. AFI 1-2 underscores three distinct guidelines for commanders: 1) Ensure ability to execute the primary mission at any time, 2) Train and develop airmen to support de-

ployment taskings, and 3) Maintain the ability to command and control the unit against all relevant threats and hazards to assure mission success.

While the 190th's primary mission rests with aerial refueling, every shop on base must perform their individual missions prior to any KC-135R takeoff. By coupling these guidelines with our vision, "A world-class organization recognized as the standard of excellence by those we serve," we highlight a desired outcome when performing our day-to-day duties. We uphold doing our jobs, the best we can.

The highlighted list of accomplishments just scratches the surface of 190th achievements this year and does not include the many national and Kansas individual awards given to our outstanding airmen recognizing their important contributions. While reading through these, we see repetitive validations toward our mission execution major graded area and our vision. The 190th provided mission

ready and deployment prepared airmen world-wide. We flew the highest number of hours supporting multiple combatant commands corroborating our primary mission. In 2015, we clearly executed our mission with accolades and recognition exhibiting our high standard of excellence throughout. 
