

The biggest difference between the Air Guard and the Air Force is the part-time versus full-time.

MONEY FOR COLLEGE

In the Kanas Air Guard, we believe in helping you achieve your educational goals and we do everything we can to help out along the way.

A Kansas Air Guardsman's tuition is fully covered up to 15 credit hours per semester at no cost to the member.

The Montgomery G.I. Bill helps pay for college expenses- and that's just the beginning of the education benefits the Air Guard provides.

A curtailed list of careers available specifically to you will be determined once you complete the ASVAB and pass the MEPS Physical. Your recruiter can then take you on a tour of the career fields you are interested in.



HOW TO JOIN

Ready to Join? There are five steps to the process of joining and our recruiters are experienced and ready to assist with the process.

Step # 1: THE INTERVIEW

Meet with your recruiter in their office where you will be prescreened for health, drug use, law violations and body art. Once it is determined that you have met the pre-screen requirements, the ASVAB and physical examination can be scheduled.

Step # 2: The ASVAB

The ASVAB exam is a computer based test given to everyone who enters any branch of the military. The Air Guard uses your scores to determine your abilities in the following areas: Mechanical, Administration, General Knowledge and Electronics. The jobs available to you to choose from will be directly related to your score on the ASVAB.

Step # 3: PHYSICAL EXAMINATION

All applicants must complete the physical examination at MEPS (Military Entrance Processing Station) located in Kansas City. For the physical, you will be required to provide your complete medical history and be given a complete physical exam to ensure you qualify for military service.

Step # 4: JOB SELECTION

With the ASVAB and Physical Exam completed, you will be given a curtailed list of jobs available to you based upon your ASVAB score and Exam results. You will choose three of the careers on the list that you would like to take a tour of and the recruiter will set up the meeting. If you need to check out more than three careers, notify your recruiter to schedule additional time.

Step # 5: OATH OF ENLISTMENT

Congratulations! You are now a proud member of the 190th Air Refueling Wing! Be sure to invite your family and friends to be present at your oath.

STUDENT FLIGHT

Once you join you will attend Unit Training Assembly (UTA), one weekend a month and receive a paycheck (even before you leave for basic) as part of Student Flight. Saturdays will be spent job shadowing in your chosen career. Sundays will be spent with other Student Flight Members, just like you, who are preparing for Basic Military Training (BMT) where we will set you up for success, learning the various tasks you will be expected to learn at BMT. This will also be a great opporunity to connect with other unit members and learn about our mission and values.

You will leave for BMT within one year of joining and this can be discussed with your recruiter to determine the ideal date based upon your schedule. Immediately upon graduation of BMT you will then go to your specific Technical School based upon your career choice. Locations vary and the locations of training are provided by your recruiter.

BMT is 8.5 weeks, your Tech School length will vary but will be between 5 weeks to over one year depending on the career.

ELIGIBILITY

Ready to start the process? If you are between the ages of 17 and 39 you are eligible to enlist. If you are 17, you must have your Junior year of high school completed and get consent from your parents. You will not leave for basic until you graduate from high school. Prior service personnel can join at any age as long as they can complete 20 years total service before the age of 60.
